CHAIRMAN'S DESK – JUNE 2012

You may not be aware, but a lot of good work is going on behind the scenes to streamline our administrative procedures and with membership renewals. We have also made progress with the development of the RAEME National Association; and the RAEME Corps History Project (CHP). Additionally, we are reviewing the methods and ways in which we conduct all of our activities, including our two most important annual events, the RAEME Birthday Luncheon and ANZAC Day.

We are not contemplating major changes, but our aim is to improve our administration and reduce the workload on your very busy committee. We would be very interested in any thoughts you have on improvements we can make on your behalf with the running of the Association or our many annual events.

One area in urgent need of improvement is the management and accuracy of our membership records and procedures. We ask for your assistance as we renew our subscriptions this year, and introduce changes that may be necessary as your Committee considers incorporation. In particular, I ask that you return your annual subscription forms and ensure they are properly completed as requested by our Membership Chair, Stu Bowles. We would also like to see all non-financial members consider becoming financial as we go through the 'tidying up' process. ANZAC Day 2012 was another fabulous day for our Corps members (past and present) and our RAQ members, as we turned-out in sound numbers to march through the CBD, and then join in the remembrance and the fellowship activities at the Port Office Hotel. We should once again take off our hats off to Ernie Hartshorn and Jeff Maurice for organising another great event. Thanks must also go to our diggers, and WO2 Troy Amy, from ASEME/ALTC detachment, Enoggera, for providing the Banner Guard and being part of the marching contingent – well done lads. Major Ian Leabeater led, the Banner Guard and our COL COMDT QLD Region COL Richard Kluckhohn led the RAEME contingent – thank you gentlemen for a fine professional job. Once again the staff of the Port Office Hotel looked after us, making us feel welcome and the day complete.

Judging from the response to the recent Spanner Pack distribution our packs are more popular than ever with our troops on deployment. We even have several RAEME folk, deployed in the Sudan, so Spanner Packs were sent to them as well as RAEME personnel deployed in the other locations. The total number of packs sent to all areas of operations to date is 2525, which means that some 3500 of our Corps diggers and support staff have received them in recent years. I have provided the editor with some of the many letters of appreciation, we have received from the troops, but sadly we cannot print them all.

The development of the RAEME National Association has taken a couple of important steps forward. I will provide a more detailed summary of the work going on to establish our RAEME National Association at another time, but suffice it to say here, the National Association's Strategic Plan has been issued to all the regional associations. For those who may not know, the RAEME National Association has the following Mission and Goals:

- Mission of the RAEME National Association As a volunteer organization, promote and preserve the spirit de corps, reputation, and history of the RAEME Corps through its past, present and future members.
- The goals of the RAEME National Association's management organization are as follows: Promote the Corps' identity and reputation across Australia; recognise and celebrate the achievements of the members of the Corps; provide a focal point for Corps activities nationally and regionally.

In addition, the RAEME National Association website is now up and working, and although still in its infancy, we are indebted to an ex-RAEME member for his support and assistance in getting it to its current state. CAPT Richard Legge (RTD) has kindly changed an existing website, which features most of the regional associations and made it a national website - I encourage you to have a look at the site and see what your brethren are up to in other states across Australia as well as use it to find out information about the Corps History Project. Corps History Project (CHP). I am very pleased to report that the Corps History Project (CHP) has commenced its work to gather suitable photographs and stories for inclusion in the next version of the RAEME Corps history.

As mentioned in our previous issue of Spanner News, the intent of this project is to celebrate the achievements of individuals, sub-units and units of the Royal Australian Electrical and Mechanical Engineering (RAEME) Corps during warlike and nonwarlike operations and peacetime training activities. The other equally important intent is to capture and record stories that have underpinned and enhanced the reputation of RAEME over the past 70 years and ensure they are recorded in perpetuity. Over the last quarter I am pleased to report on the following:

- Both the Northern and Southern CHP Teams have now met and individuals are getting on with a range of assigned tasks.
- The CHP now has a presence on the RAEME National Association's website, which also provides a link to the CHP Face Book page. This is a major step forward so go to <u>www.raeme.org.au</u> and click on the Face book banner for details of how to get your stories to the project team.
- The CHP face book site is in place and promoting the project, and the email address for contributions is being promulgated progressively as time passes – note it is <u>raemebookproject@hotmail.com</u>.
- The two editors have compiled a 'straw man' framework of the book in a similar format to the Army's annual publication entitled, 'Army in Profile', to provide potential writers and supporters an idea of the finished article. This 'straw man' will be sent to the CHP Editorial Board for concurrence and will be ready in July 2012.
- Richard Kluckhohn is redoing the Communications Strategy for inclusion in the CHP Plan.
- Chris Mead, Deputy PD for the CHP, has re-drafted the CHP Plan to ensure the detail is up to date and relevant as the project matures.
- The SO2 Corps Heritage, MAJ Graham Anderson is looking at ways of publishing the book and seeking financial support from existing organisations like the Army History Unit, Australian War Memorial and the agency which produces the 'Army in Profile'.
- There will be a feature article about the CHP in the next issue of the 'Craftsman' magazine to tie in with the 20th Anniversary of the publication of the 'Craftsman'.
- The CHP has received its first \$100 donation from a loyal Corps member. This will be placed in the 'RAEME National Association CHP Working Account' to fund the Team's activities. Other donations can be expected.
- Over the coming months more information will be provided via the RAEME National Association Face Book page and the RAEME National Association website.

AWARDS.

Australia Day 2012 Awards – CSC. As we reported in the last issue, MAJ Keirin Joyce, 1 ATSR, Enoggera was awarded the Conspicuous Service Cross for his contribution to the introduction into service of the Skylark and Scaneagle unmanned aerial systems (UAS) capability. . Keirin received his award from the Governor of Queensland, Penelope Wensley, on the 14 May 12.

For those who don't know, Major Keirin Joyce jumped across from managing Army helicopters to Unmanned Aerial Systems (UAS) in 2006 and '07, when appointed as the first Technical Support Troop (TST) Commander and Senior Maintenance Manager (SMM) at the 20th Surveillance and Target Acquisition Regiment (20 STA Regt) (old 131 Div Loc Bty). He was part of the team that introduced the Skylark and Scaneagle UAS into service, doubling and tripling as the Aviation Safety Officer and Test and Evaluation Engineer for the Force Insertion Teams on OP CATALYST (Iraq) and OP SLIPPER (Afghanistan).

Major Joyce transitioned this knowledge into the DMO during 2008 and 09 where he was the Logistics Engineer on Joint Project 129 (JP129), contributing first to terminating the flailing contract that was underway, and then restarting the project as a Foreign Military Sales (FMS) acquisition with the United States Army for the Shadow 200 UAS.

Staying with the program, Major Joyce posted into Army HQ in 2010 as the Capability Manager Desk Officer for UAS responsible for the Skylark, Scaneagle and Shadow 200, and was seconded back to the DMO in 2011 to run JP129 as the Project Manager. Shadow 200 was delivered ahead of schedule, under budget, and immediately deployed to Afghanistan where it has replaced the Scaneagle.

COMMUNICATION AND CONTACTS

Progress on the Fair Indexation Bill – A Fight for Fair, Just and Equal Indexation. This update from our DFWA Representative, Peter Snowdon, gives our members a broad summary of the status of the current campaign:

DFWA is still heavily involved in the fight to get the Government (ANY Government) to agree to grant

veterans and retired members a fair, equal and just indexation. The fight continues with Operation Aware and several follow-on activities. 'The fight continues'...that refrain has become a bit of a theme song lately, but it does continue and the pace is increasing.

The most notable activity in recent weeks has been a series of excellent interviews with Air Vice Marshal Peter Criss (Retd) on a variety of television and radio stations. They are well worth listening to so browse www.standto.org for the detail of the discussions.

There have been a lot of articles and updates recently from the DFWA. There has also been an article on 7:30 Queensland on the ABC, which outlined all the key points of the argument for a better indexation method, but it was heavily edited and lost a lot of impact. The subject was well aired at the time.

Another development has been the notice of motion put to the House of Representatives by Independent Rob Oakshott, seconded by Tony Windsor, about the need to improve Defence pension and superannuation indexation. It was debated on Monday 18 June 12, and detail will be provided on the outcome later. Bear in mind that this is not a Member's Bill for Legislation – it is only a debate. While such a debate is not definitive in itself, and will not bind the Government to anything, it does raise the level of parliamentary and public awareness of our plight and is recorded in Hansard. Rob Oakshott's Motion is:

"MEMBER FOR Lyne : I give notice that on the next day of sitting I shall move that this House:

(1) recognises the:

(a) involvement of Australian service men and women in war and peacekeeping operations; and

(b) role of family, friends and community networks in supporting those Australians who have served in our military; and

(2) calls on the Government to:

(a) consider increasing the Military Superannuation and Benefits Scheme Pension, Defence Force Retirement Benefit Pension and the Defence Force Retirement and Death Benefits Pension twice annually by the greatest of the Consumer Price Index, the Pensioner and Beneficiary Living Cost Index and the Male Total Average Weekly Earnings; and

(b) do this in recognition of the unique circumstances of military service compared to all others within the public service." It could be argued that the motion does not go far enough, but it is a very good start. We wish Rob Oakshott every success.

A letter was recently sent out from Minister Snowdon's office. This letter was widely distributed to anyone who had written to him over the preceding months about Indexation.
