Hello from the membership member, there was no interest in my position at the recent AGM, so it looks like it is me for another two years? Anyone interested in learning the ropes of membership (possibly with the long term plan of taking over in a few years) let me know and I can sign you up as the assistant membership member (the portfolio is not that difficult or time consuming).

The RAQ membership numbers continue to grow, keep up the good work and ensure you ask the question of those RAEME mates you occasionally catch up with "Are you a member of the RAEME Association Queensland" and if not "Why haven't you joined?". Some exciting news is that the new Website will soon have an area that is for members only (all current financial members will be provided with a login). At this stage the area will initially only have the membership roll (data base) and once you have logged in you will be able to view **your** complete record (I want to strongly assure everyone that you will only be able to view your record, so therefore others will not be able to view your personal data). Once logged in you will be able to update your record, if for example you have change telephone numbers, email or moved house, you can update the data base directly. You will also be able to view the current membership (names only) to possibly look

up those long lost friends? If you see a name on the list that you think is the long lost friend and wish to contact them then you will be able to send them a message. We still haven't finalised how you will be able to contact them but it will either be send an email to the committee and we will forward it on your behalf or if the technology allows we will set up a system where you click on the person's name and send them an email directly (it just won't display their email address – for privacy reasons), it will be then up to the member in question to decide if they respond?

Another new initiative that is coming soon is free lifetime membership to "Mermaid Beach AEME Surf Club". WEBMASTER

The RAQ Website continues to grow with functionality being added to the site on a regular basis. I encourage all members to visit the website, as updates can be added on a daily basis. Some interesting statistics on viewing habits for August/September include:

- The four most popular visited pages include, the Home page, Shop, Vale and Membership.
- Not surprisingly most people go to the site directly, with the second largest group able to find the site via Google

- Most users are viewing via Internet Explorer and then Google Chrome
- 80% of visitors to the site are new visits

The above information helps us understand who is viewing the site and how we can provide the most relevant content for our members and visitors. An example of this was we had an issue with viewing the site using Internet Explorer, we were able to identify this and fix how the site was displayed to ensure content was able to be accessed.

Members will also notice the following changes:

- register and pay for events organised by the association. Where enabled simply click on Join and you will be automatically registered for an event. Payment if required is also enabled. Attendees will be automatically emailed on any updates to their registration or changes to the event. Members can also 'Invite' who they think may be interested in the event and attach a personalised message. Organisers have a dashboard which allows them to keep track of attendees and manage each event.
- **CMF/Reserve Function Images** 42 photos have now been uploaded into the gallery
- RAQ Name Badges These are now uploaded as items for sale in the online shop and can be ordered and paid for online. Simply select the badge (either Magnetic or Pin Clasp) and submit your order



- **Links** At the bottom of every web page in the site map area, are all the links to our pages including any RAEME related sites.
- Membership Portal Steve Howell's has been working with the National Website Group to establish our own membership portal. This will enable members to log into their RAQ account, update details, purchase items at member price and also allow for member only content and viewing. It will also allow emails to be sent out to members from the website via the committee.
- Mermaid Beach AEME Surf Life Saving Club - A new page has been raised to promote the SLS Club including the life member application form for all current RAQ

members, we also have a history of the club available to download.


Once again, I have taken the liberty of adding two more abridged excerpts from the book for your enjoyment.

Support to Special Forces. "With spring (March to May) in Afghanistan comes the fighting season. As the mountain snow recedes, Afghani tribesmen are once again able to move around the mountains and through the mountain passes. Traditionally the tribesmen have used the improved conditions of the fighting season to settle blood feuds and harass invading forces. In the current conflict the target of the tribesmen's wrath has been the coalition forces and those Afghanis who support them. As the 2010 fighting season developed and Taliban fighters travelled across the mountains into the Orūzgān Province, SOTG Rotation 13 arrived in country. The new rotation included Warrant Officer Class 2 Wes Lynch, ASM of the Logistic Support Squadron Workshop. The Workshop was tasked with providing first to third line maintenance support to equipment of SOTG, and recovery support. The Logistics Support Squadron consisted of a HQ, a Workshop Troop (minus), a Q store Section, a Transport Cell, a Catering detachment and medical personnel.

Logistic Support Squadron members were drawn from predominantly Special Operations Command units including; Special Air Service Regiment (SASR, 2 Commando Regiment (2 CDO), Special Operations Logistic Squadron (SOLS) and the Special Operations Engineer Regiment (SOER). As ASM, Wes Lynch acknowledges, Rotation 13 was extremely fortunate to deploy with some very gifted tradesmen. Even so, prior to deployment, Wes had thought it unlikely that in this modern battlefield, a troop of RAEME soldiers would be independently let loose in an AO to conduct FRT tasks. The following story is witness to the fact that at least in this case, an ASM can be wrong!

The war fighters within SOTG were becoming very efficient at seeking out and destroying enemy fighters; using a combination of rotary wing aircraft and vehicle-mounted patrols, as the Fighting Elements (FE) pushed the Taliban deeper into 'Indian country'. An FRT deployed with all vehicle mounted patrols, initially comprised a VM and toolbox. Subsequently this grew to three tradesmen in a Workshop 'Mother Ship', an up-armoured Unimog fitted with a heavy weapon mount.

"The greatest threat to all vehicle mounted operations came from Improvised Explosive Devices (IEDs). During Rotation 13, a number of SOTG vehicles were damaged by IEDs (one driver experienced three events) all without sustaining FRTs supporting the patrols worked iniuries. tirelessly to rebuild or jury rig each vehicle to allow it to be 'A-framed' back to the Main Supply Route (MSR). Once the damaged vehicle was back on the MSR, the Workshop up-armoured Mack wrecker was deployed to do a pick-up run. This task usually comprised a four-vehicle packet, with engineer route clearance support and a signaller in the command vehicle. With the FE and the damaged vehicle, a transfer of equipment would occur to a clean vehicle in the packet and the crock would be put onto the recovery trailer. This story is not remarkable as our

soldier/tradesmen are highly trained and cable of turning on an almost unsupported operation in a hostile environment; providing their own planning, medical, signal and fire support."

The long road for justice in other areas of Super such as: Indexation for under 55s and MSBS; disability pensions; war widows; commutation end date; and life expectancy tables stretches before us. We have already started that journey. For more detail see DFWA Update No 284 Aug 2014 which is available on the DFWA website www.dfwa.org.au

By "we" I mean all of us who write and petition our local members and the members of the various exservice organisations, especially the member organisations of ADSO. One of the more active of

these is the DFWA. These are the unsung heroes of the fight and it is probably high time we paused and reflected on who these dedicated team are and give them due respect. Without their dedication none of the progress we are making would have occurred.

Heading up the DFWA Head Office team is David Jamison who has led the DFWA for some seven years now. Since the formation of ADSO three years ago David's workload has increased, often at great expense to his personal and family life. Ably assisting David in Canberra is the Executive Director Alf Jaugietis and Treasurer Paul Jones.

Up here in sunny Queensland, the Queensland Branch local blokes are President Rob Shortridge, Secretary Rod Brittain and Treasurer/Senior Advocate Wally Buldo. All dedicated and hardworking people looking after your interests.

The following is an example of individual efforts by some who are beavering away on their own to right the remaining wrongs with our Super system.

A number of papers have been presented by one of our members to Cathy McGowan on issues about DFRDB. Cathy is the Independent Federal Member for Indi, which is down Albury way. As a result of this, Cathy and Andrew Wilkie MP had a meeting and the following ensued:

" Mr Wilkie moved an amendment- that all words after "that" be omitted with a view to substituting the following words... " the House calls on the Government: (1) to expand the scope of the bill to include all recipients of the DFRB and DFRDB schemes, regardless of age..." The amendment was put and lost with support only coming from Mr Wilkie, Ms. McGowan, Mr. Bandt and Mr. Katter.

No surprises there!

Briefing papers were also presented to Ms McGowan on:

- Commutation.
- Non-Commuting member and the penalty paid in unfair indexation.
- Spouses Benefits and the impact of number 2 above.
- Indexation for those under 55 years.
- Historical Rates of DFRDB and Service Pensions.

You can see that we can all make a contribution in our fight for justice in the many anomalies with DFRDB/DFRB/MSBS. So if you have any grievance with your own circumstances in any of these, get the pen out and write to your local

member. The political affiliation doesn't matter, if your local member cares about his constituents, he / she will normally ask a question at least. The more of us who do this the more questions will be asked, but it all starts with us.

Now the Commercial. DFWA needs your support.
