RAEMUS ROVER Supporting Mates 4 Mates.

The RAEMUS Rover Race Team (RRRT) has slowly evolved over the past 2 years, following the re-birthing of the old Puckapunyal Wksp Coy based race car, into a current CAMS compliant active off road race car. The development goes further in that the RRRT is now running a team of three cars. RAEMUS Rover now consists of the original old girl from the 1970's and 1980's, and now includes another Land Rover with a Series 3 body covering a slightly warm LS1 engine complemented by full race spec transmission, plus a Pro-Late class 'Off Road' buggy powered by an mildly angry alloy V8.

The team is based around a group of current and exserving RAEME members, who work tirelessly to provide an active and beneficial challenging activity for injured and ill veterans from the RSL's Mates4Mates organisation. This year the team has nine 'Mates' from Mates4Mates to help through-out the 2015 season, which include events within the South East Queensland area, plus a key activity – the Finke Desert Rally in Alice Springs.

The RAEMUS team relies heavily on the training knowledge and experience gained within the Corps in developing trade training for the 'Mates' across all trade disciplines. This training supports the veterans, who are seeking either a life-changing experience, or to gain confidence and experience working on cars, so they can be applied to a hobby of their own.

Other work the team undertakes is to provide an attractive activity for those, who are absorbed in extended periods of rehabilitation or therapy and are seeking a break or respite. The team doesn't wrap our 'Mates' in cotton wool, nor do we identify them in other way other than being a team member. The good old RAEME Wksp banter is very much alive and encouraged. Less than perfect trade efforts are accommodated in a supportive and corrective manner.

The team's most recent activity at Willowbank Motor sport precinct saw the team featured on Channel 9 news nationally on 11 April. Look at the link below and you will see the Corps "tri-colour" in front of the car on most shots. As the team has expanded it has raised the challenge of now finding a new home for the expanded team and its equipment. Currently talks are in progress to secure a shed at the Willowbank facility. OTHER HAPENINGS






CORPS HISTORY



DFWA COMMUNICATIONS

What's been happening? It has been a very quiet reporting period. DFWA is still working on all items previously reported such as widows' pensions and disability pensions, but there has been no significant response from Government. Clearly, if you read the papers, they are preoccupied with 'more pressing matters!

A DFWA member recently presented a paper to his local member on the dreadful situation where pension recipients are short-changed with our DFRDB pensions post commutation. Recipients may have sustained significant financial loses, which may continue for some time. This situation relates directly to the calculation of reduced pension after commuting, related to the Whole of Life tables of, put succinctly, when you are expected to die. These present tables were assessed in 1964 or thereabouts. Over the years, life expectancy has extended dramatically. In short, recipients will now be expected to draw on a reducing pension until death. To expect recipients to make ends meet, including potentially some with mortgages, when the drawing power of their pensions is reducing, is unacceptable and very disappointing. The government must understand that this very vulnerable group in the community will need assistance. As more information on progress on this comes to hand, I will publish it
